With generous donor support, we completed critical infrastructure upgrades at the North Shelter and major refurbishments at the South Shelter—creating spaces that honour the resilience, comfort, and wellbeing of the people we serve.

Our CEO, Andrine Johnson, navigated a series of unexpected challenges during this work, including severe weather events and construction delays. Her determination and leadership ensured that these essential renovations were completed with care and integrity.

At the same time, our dedicated Embrave team advanced important program development efforts, including Anti-Human Trafficking initiatives, expanded Public Education programming, and enhanced Food Hamper supports. These initiatives deepen our commitment to meeting the diverse needs of survivors and strengthen our impact across the community.

These achievements have also increased our visibility and connection with the public—through community partnerships, media engagement, podcasts, and television and radio outreach. This growing awareness is essential in confronting and ending gender-based violence.

As Chair of the Board for 2025–2026, my focus is to work closely with our Board Members and leadership team to advance the following priorities:

- **Financial Accountability:**

Building on our progress with the Profit & Loss review and the engagement of a new accounting firm, we will continue strengthening oversight processes to support long-term stability and responsible growth.

- **Engagement and Culture:**

We will enhance internal stewardship by ensuring that our skilled and compassionate staff have the resources, support, and organizational culture necessary to lead with care, insight, and trauma-informed practice.

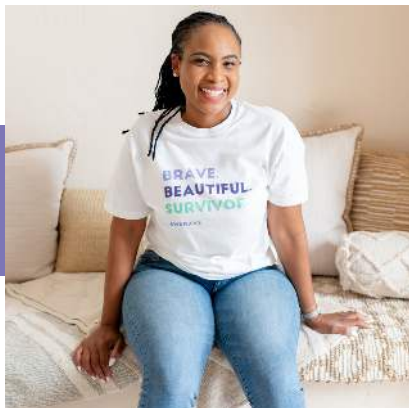
- **Strategic Planning:**

Dear Region of Peel and Gender-Based Violence Community,

As 2024–2025 marks my second year as CEO of Embrave Agency to End Violence, I extend my sincere gratitude to our Board of Directors, funders, staff, partners, and community collaborators for your continued trust, partnership, and support. This reporting period was marked by unprecedented challenges; however, through collective resilience, transparency, and shared commitment, we were able to navigate and overcome significant hurdles while remaining grounded in our mission.

Despite serious infrastructure challenges—including the temporary closure of our North Shelter and the difficult decision to lay off staff, Embrave remained steadfast in its responsibility to survivors and their children. Through adaptability, strong governance, and an unwavering commitment to trauma-informed practice, we worked diligently to stabilize operations and ensure continuity of essential support for individuals and families impacted by gender-based violence.

The reopening of the North Shelter after seven months was made possible through the generous investment of various funders who supported critical renovation and infrastructure costs. This support restored a safe, dignified, and trauma-informed environment at a time of heightened community need. More importantly, it demonstrated the strength of community collaboration and reaffirmed our shared responsibility in addressing gender-based violence, recognizing that GBV is not an isolated issue, but a systemic and community-wide concern that requires coordinated, sustained action across sectors.

Looking ahead, Embrave remains deeply committed to strengthening and expanding its program capacity through the development and implementation of innovative, responsive, and survivor-centred services. By broadening our advocacy efforts, strengthening partnerships, and enhancing support, we aim to better meet the evolving needs of those impacted by gender-based violence. This continued growth will ensure survivors have access to comprehensive, trauma-informed care while advancing prevention, systemic change, and long-term safety across our communities.

Despite the challenges faced and those ahead, I remain firmly committed to our community and to survivors, advancing awareness and advocating for meaningful social and systemic change to prevent and ultimately eradicate gender-based violence.

Wrapped in Courage

November marks Woman Abuse Prevention Month and the official launch of the Annual Wrapped in Courage campaign organized by the Ontario Association of Interval & Transition Houses (OAITH).

Gender-based violence (GBV) agencies across Ontario ask community members to wear a purple scarf to show their support for survivors of GBV within their community and beyond.

In partnership with Armagh, we organized Wrapped in Courage Flag Raisings in the City of Brampton and Mississauga. Embrave also attended the OAITH Queen's Park Reception and Lobby Day.

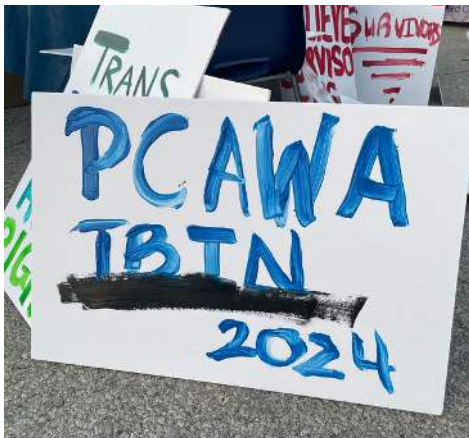

PEEL COMMITTEE AGAINST WOMEN ABUSE

Established in 1984, the Peel Committee Against Women Abuse (PCAWA) is a cross-sectoral community collaborative made up of member organizations and community members in the Region of Peel that have a shared commitment to ending gender-based violence. Embrace Agency to End Violence is the PCAWA's lead member organization.

| Take Back the Night

On September 19, 2024, PCAWA hosted Take Back the Night in our community. Take Back the Night is an annual anti-violence rally and march that is held to increase awareness and support of women and gender diverse person's right to live without the fear of violence, focusing particularly on ending sexual violence.



| December 6th Vigil

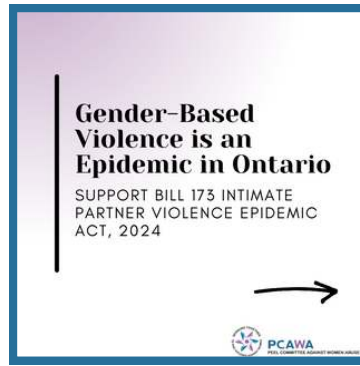
PCAWA hosted a virtual December 6th Vigil to acknowledge and remember those who have been killed in an act of gender-based violence. Together as a community we joined online to listen to guest speakers and performers to come together in remembrance, strength and solidarity.



Bill 173 Advocacy

PCAWA engaged in advocacy in support of Bill 173, which would formally declare intimate-partner violence an epidemic in the Province of Ontario.

We connected with all 12 MPPs in Peel Region to schedule meetings to discuss the importance of Bill 173 and government action in addressing gender-based violence.



Bill 173 Intimate Partner Violence Epidemic Act, 2024 Passes to Third Reading

Yesterday PCAWA was present to hear Bill 173 pass its second reading in the Ontario Legislature. We commend the provincial government for their support on this Bill and listening to the call for this action from advocates and survivors across the province.

It was an incredibly emotional moment, knowing that we have been a part of the provincial movement of advocates who have been working towards this moment. 94 communities have declared intimate-partner violence an epidemic, and Peel Region represents 4 of them. This moment showed the power of advocacy, coordination, community and solidarity.

URGENT: Pass Bill 173 Before the Summer Break!

PCAWA sent a letter to all 12 MPPs in the Region of Peel requesting a meeting to discuss Bill 173 and the importance of passing the Bill before the Legislature rises for the summer.

Gender-based violence is a public health emergency and it doesn't take the summer off!

Region of Peel Gender-Based Violence Resource Guide

This Region of Peel Gender-Based Violence Resource Guide was developed to provide a clear, detailed and comprehensive overview of supports and services available to survivors of gender-based violence in the Region of Peel.

This resource guide originated from the identified need for service providers to better collaborate and coordinate services for survivors in our community.
